What do Bus and Truck Mechanics and Diesel Engine Specialists do?

Bus and truck mechanics and diesel engine specialists use a large base of knowledge to perform a variety of tasks on heavy-duty trucks, large construction vehicles, buses, and tractor trailers. They inspect, diagnose, and repair brake systems, engines, electrical components, steering systems, transmissions, and tires. They are employed in a wide variety of settings. They may work on a vehicle's electrical system, make major engine repairs, or retrofit exhaust systems with emission control systems to comply with pollution regulations. In addition to using computerized diagnostic equipment, bus and truck mechanics and diesel engine specialists use a variety of power and machine tools, such as pneumatic wrenches, lathes, grinding machines, and welding equipment.

Training & Educational Opportunities

You will have plenty of employment opportunities as a truck and engine mechanic, but first you will need to earn a certificate or associate degree. To do this, you will complete coursework in diesel engine fundamentals, electrical systems, and power generation. Once hired, some employers may require one to two years of on-site training.

As a Bus and Truck Mechanic or Diesel Engine Specialist you will:

- Change brakes
- Repair malfunctioning components
- Retrofit engines
- Test drive trucks before and after repairs
- Use computers to diagnose and trouble shoot
- Use welding skills
