TRANSPORTATION AND DISTRIBUTION MANAGER

What do Transportation and Distribution Managers do?

Transportation and distribution managers use a large base of knowledge to plan, direct, or coordinate the transportation, storage or distribution operations within an organization. They work with companies that provide transportation services, store and distribute materials or products, or manage logistics personnel and systems. Transportation, storage, and distribution managers are in charge of allocating and shipping merchandise in the most efficient and cost-effective manner. They analyze costs, develop budgets, and comply with government regulations. They must negotiate with equipment dealers, transportation service workers, and end-users to find optimal service.

Training & Educational Opportunities

You will have plenty of employment opportunities as a transportation and distribution manager, but first you will need to earn a certificate or an associate degree. To do this, you will complete coursework in personnel recruitment, resource allocation, geometry, statistics and leadership techniques, among others.

As a Transportation and Distribution Manager you will:

- Direct dispatching and routing of transportation vehicles
- Interview, select, and train warehouse and supervisory personnel
- Plan, organize, and manage staff to ensure work is accomplished
- Prepare or direct preparation of reports, maintenance, and safety manuals
- Supervise the work of logistics specialists, planners, or schedulers
