What is the WIOA Young Adult Program?

The WIOA Young Adult Program is designed to support young adults living in Kankakee County between the ages of 16-24. The goal is to help young adults in achieving academic or occupational skills that are necessary to prepare them for todays very competitive workforce.

This is a year round program. Once a participant is accepted into the program, They will meet with staff and develop an educational and career plan. They will set short and long term goals. They must maintain monthly contact with staff to review their progress towards these goals. Students in GED or college classes must attend classes regularly. Non-participation will result in a loss of services.

Paid work experience is available for students who have good classroom attendance and are passing all classes.

Eligibility:

- High School dropout
- Basic skills deficient (function below an 8th grade level.)
- Pregnant or parenting
- Low income (receiving food stamps or TANF.)
- Homeless
- High School graduate needing college assistance.

Assistance Includes:

- GED testing fees
- Transportation
- College transition assistance
- College scholarships
- Job skills training
- Job search assistance
- Paid work experience

To enroll in the program, you will need to schedule an appointment. During the initial appointment you will need to bring with you...

Social security card.

A photo ID.

Proof of income if not on a food stamp or TANF case.

You will need to take a short math and reading test. Please allow about an hour for this appointment.
