What do Computer and **Information Systems Managers do?**

Computer and information systems (CIS) managers are employed in a wide variety of companies and organizations that help implement and oversee computer-related activity. They often work with top executives to help determine the computing system needs for a company and produce a plan to meet those needs. The CIS manager is responsible for administering and implementing all computer-related technologies, including network security, internet operations, and software upgrades. An entire organization's computer efforts may be overseen by the CIS manager. For example, they may supervise the installation of new computer hardware and the maintenance of security networks. Finally, they must always be aware of emerging technologies and upgrades.

Training & Educational Opportunities

You'll have plenty of employment options as a computer and information systems manager, but first you'll need to earn a bachelor degree. You will probably work in the field prior to becoming a manager. Coursework includes classes in computer science, math, computer programming, and software development.

As a CIS Manager you will:

- Administer and implement computer-related technologies
- Maintain internet operations and software upgrades
- Maintain security networks

- Manage computer support specialists and programmers
- Supervise installation of new hardware
