

What do Occupational Therapy Assistants do?

Occupational therapy assistants work with occupational therapists to help their clients develop and recover activities of daily living, like getting dressed, driving, and working. Some choose to work with children, helping them with typical childhood activities, including learning, playing, and growing. Others work with students who have learning disabilities, behavioral problems, cerebral palsy, down syndrome, or other disabilities. Occupational therapy assistants also work with adults in their homes, rehabilitation centers, nursing homes, and other facilities.

Occupational Therapy Assistants are in demand in Livingston County!

Livingston County employment of occupational therapy assistants is expected to increase through 2020. The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics recognizes the job outlook for this career as growing much faster than average.

Training & Educational Opportunities

Occupational therapy assistants need an associate degree from an accredited occupational therapy assistant program. People interested in becoming an occupational therapy assistant should take high school courses in biology and health education. You will increase your chances of getting into a community college or technical school program by doing volunteer work in a healthcare setting. You will need to pass an exam to become a licensed occupational therapy assistant in the state of Illinois.

As an Occupational Therapy Assistant you will:

- Help clients with rehabilitative activities and exercises outlined in a treatment plan
- Help patients get dressed
- > Lift and move patients

- Monitor an individual's activities to make sure they are performed correctly
- > Record patients' progress
