

What do Computer Programmers do?

Computer programmers write and test code that allows
computer applications and software programs to function properly.

They also turn the program designs created by software developers and engineers into instructions that a computer can follow. In addition, they test newly created applications and programs to ensure expected results are produced. If not, codes are inspected for mistakes and rewritten. Programmers work closely with software developers, and in some businesses their duties overlap. When such overlap occurs, programmers can do work that is typical of developers, such as designing the program. Program design entails planning the software initially, creating models and flowcharts detailing how the code is to be written, writing and debugging code, and designing an application or systems interface.

Training & Educational Opportunities

You will have plenty of employment opportunities as a computer programmer, but first you will have to earn a bachelor or associate degree. Most employers prefer those with a bachelor degree. Programmers who work in specific fields, such as healthcare or accounting, may take classes to specialize in that field to supplement their degree in computer programming. In addition, employers value experience, which many students gain through internships.

As a Computer Programmer you will:

- Create and test code in an integrated development environment (IDE)
- Test programs for errors and fix the faulty lines of computer code
- Update and expand existing programs
