Training

Jobs in Livingston County's TDL industry require education and training after high school, yet they don't always require a four year degree. Depending on your career interests and professional goals, you can chose a training program from several weeks to more than four years. Here are some examples below:

1 Year or Less Certificate Program

- Bus Driver
- Maintenance and Repair Worker
- Truck Driver

1 to 2 Years Certificate Program

- Automotive Service Technicians and Mechanics
- Industrial Machinery Mechanic
